





Varadero/Matanzas -1 night

Day 1 Velasco Hotel

Arrive at Varadero airport (or Havana) and transfer to hotel.

Soroa - 3 nights

Day 2 - Villa Soroa - BD

We travel through picturesque rural countryside to the UNESCO Sierra de Rosario biosphere reserve.

Day 3 - Villa Soroa - BLD

Today we visit the self-sustainable community of Las terrazas and the historic Buena Vista Coffee Plantation. Then swim in the natural waterfalls at Los Baños de San Juan.

Day 4 - Villa Soroa - BD

An interpretive walk in the Orchid Garden is followed by a visit to a local educational facility to meet with students and spend interactive time with them. The afternoon is free to enjoy the tranquil area.

Vinales - 2 Nights

Day 5 - Casa Particular - BD

We visit an Artist's Antique Restoration Cooperative which repairs and reproduces sculptures, paintings and frescos followed with a visit to a local artist home where he teaches painting to the children of the community. Tonight visit a Trova House where local musicians and dancers provide entertainment.

Day 6 - Casa Particular - B

Viñales Valley is one of the most scenic and extraordinary areas in Cuba, and has been



named a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Take a guided walk through tobacco fields, learn first-hand about the labour intensive process from planting to harvesting tobacco. The balance of the day is free to further explore this small community.

Havana - 3 nights

Day 7 - Hotel Sevilla - BD

Colonial Old Havana or "La Habana Vieja" is a living museum and UNESCO World Heritage Site. This compact area is replete with museums, dining choices and music venues. Tonight's included dinner is at a Paladar.

Day 8 - Hotel Sevilla - B

A walking tour of Old Havana reveals the rich history of the area with its many mythical figures and amazing combination of various styles of architecture as we visit the four primary colonial squares. The aftermoon is free to explore on your own.

Day 9 - Hotel Sevilla - BD

Today tour "Modern Havana", developed during the 40's and 50's when the United States and Mafia dominated Havana. We will stop at the Hotel Nacional and the Columbus Cemetery. Another quirky place we will visit

today is Parque John Lennon – where a life sized statue of the famous Beatle sits on a park bench.

Cieñfuegos - 2 nights

Day 10 - Faro Luna Beach Hotel - BD

On our way to the beach we stop in the City of Cienfuegos. Both French and Spanish influence can be seen in the Palacio de Valle and the Teatro Tomas Terry (theater). Following some free time we travel out of the city to our quiet seaside hotel overlooking the Caribbean Sea.

Day 11 - Faro Luna Beach Hotel - B

Beach Day! Today is yours to relax and enjoy the Caribbean. Perhaps there will be a baseball game in town for those interested or a performance at the theatre. Your guide can make arrangements for you to attend.

Trinidad - 2 nights

Day 12 - Casa Particular - BD

Today we step back in time when we arrive in Trinidad and explore the cobble stoned streets which remain as they were in the 16th century. Visit the Historical Museum of Trinidad. Take an optional percussion or salsa lesson.

Day 13 - Casa Particular - BL

This morning we climb aboard a former Soviet army truck and wind our way into the Escambray Mountains, and then continue by foot on a scenic hiking trail through this coffee growing region.

Bogota - 2 nights

Day 1 - Hotel Regina

Bienvenidos a Colombia! Welcome to Colombia. Bogota is located at an elevation of about 2,650m (8,660 ft) on a plateau in the Andes Mountains. Arrive and transfer to your

Day 2 - Hotel Regina - BD


Visit Bogotá's famous Gold Museum. It has the largest collection in the world containing more than 55,000 pieces of gold. Finish the tour at Plaza de Mercado de Paloquemao, a visit that will engage all of your senses. The market is divided into sections: flowers; fruit, vegetables and aromatic herbs; and meat and fish. The afternoon is free.

Villa de Leyva -2 nights

Day 3 - Hospederia La Roca - BD

Travel north to visit the Salt Cathedral of Zipaquirá, an underground Roman Catholic Church constructed over 200ft underground in the tunnels and caves of an old salt mine. Continue on to the colonial town of Raquira, known as the pottery capital. Enjoy free time for lunch and shopping before our final destination, Villa de Leyva.





Day 4 - Hospederia La Roca - B

Enjoy a visit to the fossil museum. On display are ammonites and other prehistoric animals that roamed the area.

Armenia - 2 nights

Day 5 - Hostal Finca Mi Monaco - BD

Enjoy a morning in Villa de Leyva before an afternoon flight to Armenia; a city of history and beauty that is the center of commerce and trade in Colombia's coffee region.

Spend two nights outside Armenia in a traditional hacienda.

Day 6 - Hostal Finca Mi Monaco - BLD

Explore a working coffee farm. Visit a botanical garden and enjoy the many species or plants and the hundreds of hummingbirds.

Salento -1 night

Day 7 - Hotel Salento Real - BL

Travel into the Cocora Valley for a hike through the rolling hills. Lookout points offer great views of the valley's iconic 'Palmas de Cera' trees – the world's highest wax palms that grow up to 60-meters in height. That afternoon arrive in Salento, the coffee region's little piece of paradise.

Medellin - Hotel Florencia Plaza - 2 nights

Day 8 - Hotel Florencia Plaza - BD Once infamous for gangs and drug activity.

Medellin has been transformed. It's now a vibrant destination for travelers seeking a culturally rich vacation.

Day 9 - Hotel Florencia Plaza - B

Discover another side of Medellín as we travel on the city's innovative transportation system and head to Comuna 13 - a community transformed. Once controlled by the cartels, this community is a shining example of Colombia's progress in overcoming its notorious past. This afternoon we learn the fascinating legacy of Pablo Escobar, a notorious drug lord hailed as one of Colombia's most famous figures.

Taganga - 2 nights

Day 10 - Bahia Taganga Hotel - BD

Transfer to the airport for an early morning flight to Santa Martha on the Caribbean Coast. Enjoy free time to explore the small fishing village of Taganga.

Day 11 - Bahia Taganga Hotel - B

Spend the day soaking up the Caribbean feel of this coastal village. You can opt for active options like snorkeling or hiking, or relax on one of the beaches or maybe in a hammock.

Parque Nacional Natural Tayrona - 2 nights

Day 12 - Finca La Jorara Ecohotel - BLD

Today we travel to Tayrona National Park, famous for its biodiversity, wildlife and beautiful beaches. Quito - 2 nights

Day 1 - Dann Carlton Hotel

Quito is dramatically situated, squeezed between mountain peaks whose greenery is concealed by the afternoon mist. Ecuador's capital was named the very first UNESCO World Heritage site. Arrive and transfer to your hotel.

Day 2 - Dann Carlton Hotel - BD

Visit Quito's ancient and bustling Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Explore the fine collection of Ecuadorian art at Museo de Arte Colonial. Travel to over 4100m elevation on the TeleferiQO for a spectacular view of Quito and the surrounding Andean valley and volcanic peaks.

Otavalo - 1 night

Day 3 - Hacienda Pinsaqui - B

Visit the small highlands community of San Clemente. Meet locals in this traditional Andean community and enjoy an included lunch. Spend a night in the Otavalo area and visit its world famous handicrafts market, the largest in South America.



Papallacta Hot Springs - 2 nights

Day 4 - Hotel Termas Papallacta - B

Visit the home and studio of Don Miguel, a man working to keep revive an ancient art as he demonstrates every step of the weaving process, from cleaning the wool, to naturally dyeing it, to backstrap weaving. Continue to the Papallacta Hot Springs Resort for onsite hot springs, optional spa treatments, and hiking excursions.

Day 5 - Hotel Termas Papallacta - B

Visit Guango private cloud forest reserve for a walk with our guide to learn about the unique flora and fauna of the region.

Amazon - 3 nights

Day 6 - Itamandi Amazon Eco-Lodge - BLD

Next stop, the Amazon! Along the way we stop for lunch in Misahualli to view the cheeky Capuchin monkeys who call this town home. Continue to Tena to catch our motorized canoe to the Amazon lodge.

Day 7 - Itamandi Amazon Eco-Lodge - BLD

Embark on the Arajuno River to visit AmaZ00nico, an animal rescue centre that rehabilitates, reintroduces, and cares for animals who are victims of illegal trafficking.

Day 8 - Itamandi Amazon Eco-Lodge - BLD

An early departure by canoe to visit a parrot clay lick. Later, enjoy a unique cultural experience at a local family's home to learn about their traditions and what daily life is like, living in the Amazon.

Banos - 1 night

Day 9 (Banos) Hotel La Floresta - B

Depart the Amazon to Baños, a stunning town surrounded by volcanos. Along the way visit

the Omaere Ethnobotanical Park and discover ethnobotany - the study of the relationship between cultures & the plants around them.

Quito-1 night

Day 10 - Hotel Dann Carlton - BL

Enjoy a hike around Limpiopungo Lake in Cotopaxi National Park and learn about the volcano ecosystem.

San Cristobal Island - 2 nights

Day 11 - Hotel Blue Marlin - BLD

Fly to San Cristóbal, the easternmost island of Galápagos. After lunch, visit the Interpretation Centre and learn more about the history of the Galápagos.

Day 12 - Hotel Blue Marlin - BL

The day begins with a short boat ride to Isla Lobos, an islet populated by numerous sea lions. Spend the day snorkeling – a fantastic opportunity to observe the abundant marine life. See families of sea lions; spot nesting frigate birds and the famous blue-footed boobies.

Santa Cruz Island - 3 nights

Day 13 - Hotel Silberstein - BD

Visit the highlands of the island to see Galápagos giant tortoises in the wild. Explore the area and its incredible underground lava tunnels—some are more than 1km.

Day 14 - Hotel Silberstein - B

Grab a life jacket and go for a kayak adventure in the mangroves of Tortuga Bay. Afterwards relax on a beautiful fine white sand beach, and soak up some sun – you may spot some iguanas also trying to catch some rays on the shore.



Day 15 - Hotel Silberstein - B

Start the day on a boat tour of Lobería, Las Grietas and Playa de los Perros, spending time exploring, swimming, and snorkelling in the crystal clear water. Afterwards, visit the Charles Darwin Research Station, a science organization which works to preserve the Galápagos' ecosystem.

Lima - 2 nights

Day 1 - Allpa Hotel & Suites

Welcome to Lima, the capital of Peru which lies on the country's arid Pacific coast. Arrive late this evening and transfer to your hotel

Day 2 - Allpa Hotel & Suites - BD

Discover Lima's fascinating history during a tour through the historic city center. Admire the artwork at San Francisco Monastery and enter the catacombs. View the elegant Cathedral and Government Palace at Plaza de Armas. Paracas - 1 night

Arequipa - 2 nights

Day 6 - Hotel El Conquistador - BD

After breakfast, a long drive along the coastline takes you to the city of Arequipa for the night

Day 7 - Hotel El Conquistador - BL

Enjoy a walking tour around this white city, including a visit to the historic convent of Santa Catalina. Dig into Arequipa's renowned regional cuisine with a cooking class led by a chef at a traditional "picanteria" restaurant.

Sacred Valley - 2 nights

Day 8 - San Agustin Urumbamba - BL

Fly to Cuzco, the heart of the Inca civilization. Learn centuries old methods of spinning, dyeing and weaving, before browsing a colorful handicraft market.

Day 9 - San Agustin Urumbamba - BL

Our first stop is Pisac, founded during Colonial times; you will be able to appreciate the mixture of tradition.
